

Division for Early Childhood Comparison of Committees and Communities of Practice

<u>Committees</u>	Communities of Practice (CoP)
→ Established by the DEC Executive Office (EO) as an extension of the EO	→ Formed by/for professionals and families to engage in discussion, resource sharing, and activities around a shared interest, topic or practice
→ Led by the DEC EO in partnership with Committee Chairs and liaised by members of the Executive Board	→ Activity under the DEC EO, supported by the EO and CoP Development Committee
→ Embrace/Support formal <u>DEC mission and positions</u> (e.g <u>Priority Issues Agenda</u> , <u>DEC Ends Policies</u> , <u>Position Statements</u> , etc.)	→ Share interests/practices aligned with <u>DEC</u> <u>mission and positions</u> (e.g <u>Priority Issues</u> <u>Agenda</u> , <u>DEC Ends Policies</u> , <u>Position</u> <u>Statements</u> , etc.)
→ Proactively participate in developing, maintaining, and evolving strategies and initiatives crucial and central to supporting DEC's missions and positions	→ Activities driven CoP by interests and participants may create (or co-create with Committees) resources and materials to support formal DEC mission and positions
→ Have established action plans with routine communication and meetings with DEC EO and Executive Board Liaison	→ CoP facilitators may establish action plans and meetings, activities, and communication varies by CoP interests and needs
→ Members identified through a formal "call for committee members" issued by the EO and Committee Chair (DEC membership required)	→ Open invitation for anyone who shares interests/practices with the CoP to join (DEC membership required to facilitate a CoP and NOT required to participate)

^{**}Overlap may occur when Committees and CoPs share interests/practices/action plan items around DEC missions, positions and priority issues. The PPC and CoPs may collaborate on product development, review, dissemination, and participant recruitment.
